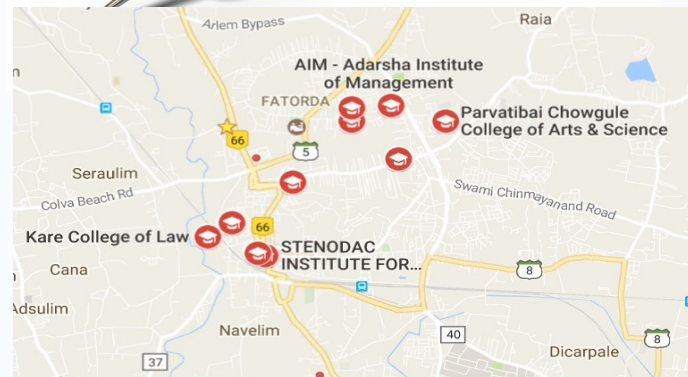

PAPER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

- ◆ Students are requested to acquire a thorough knowledge on the subject by referring research papers and reference books.
- ◆ Participants should retain proper identity card of their college or institute at the time of registration.
- ◆ Maximum two teams from each college can participate but the topics shouldn't be the same.
- ◆ The group has only Maximum 15 minutes to present their topic.
- ◆ Presentation should be done using Power Point only.
- ◆ Maximum number of slides can be 10 to adhere the time limit.
- ◆ The Presentation should be original and in English language.
- ◆ The first slide will be a title page showing the title, name of author (presenter) and college name.
- ◆ Successive slides will contain: Introduction, Objectives of the paper, Methodology, arranged in a logical sequence depending on the problem, Results and discussions and Conclusion.
- ◆ Last slide will contain references.
- ◆ Each slide will consists of 4 or 5 lines (only points to be put up on the slides).
- ◆ **The papers will be judged on the basis of content of the paper, relevance of the study and overall presentation.**
